



70-Watt-Hour Universal Notebook Battery (UPB70)

User's Manual

Introduction

Thank you for purchasing APC's 70-Watt-Hour Universal Notebook Battery (UPB70). This slim, lightweight external battery pack is compatible with many notebook computers in the market today. It is equipped with one USB port which is ideal for powering and charging iPods, MP3 players, mobile phones and portable gaming systems.

- Up to six hours of additional runtime¹ for your notebook computer
- Four selectable output voltages
- Charge and power one mobile device via a USB port
- Letter coded power tips provide compatibility with most notebook computers in the market today

- Up to 80 Watts continuous power and 90 Watts peak power

Safety Precautions

Please read the following warnings carefully before using the UPB70. Use the product according to the procedures outlined in this manual.



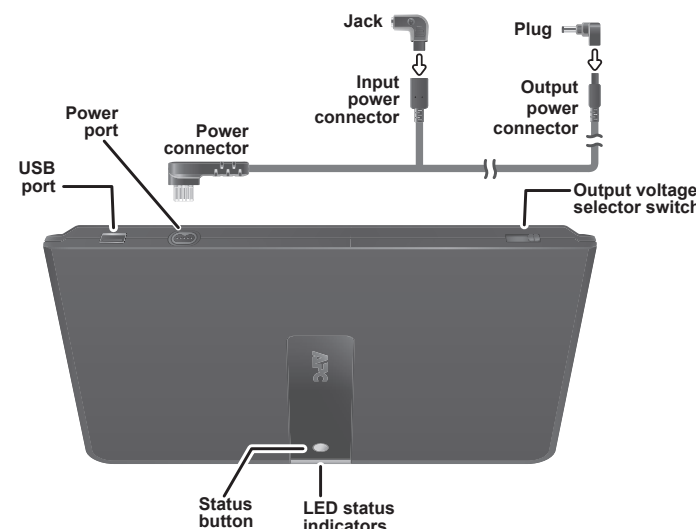
Warnings:

- **Caution:** Burn Hazard
- Do not attempt to disassemble or alter any part of this product.
- Do not store outside of the following temperature range: -4~140°F (-20~60°C).
- Do not operate outside of the following range: 32~113°F (0~45°C), as this will damage or reduce the life of the battery.
- Do not allow this product to come in contact with water or other liquids. If any liquid should reach the interior of the battery, immediately unplug the battery from your notebook. Continued use of the battery is not recommended, and may result in fire or electric shock.
- Do not expose the battery to a direct flame or heat source, as the battery may explode.

Prior to Use

This user manual provides operating instructions for the UPB70. Please read the entire user manual prior to use and remember to register your product. You can do this via the enclosed warranty card or by visiting <http://warranty.apc.com> and using keycode p668y.

A. Setting the Output Voltage

Confirm that the UPB70 is compatible with your notebook computer by finding the corresponding model listing and voltage requirements in the *Universal Notebook Battery Compatibility Guide*. Individual voltage ratings can also be found on your notebook computer's system label or power adapter label.

1. Remove advisory sticker from output voltage selector switch.
2. Slide the output voltage selector switch toward the symbol representing the notebook's required voltage.
3. Press the **Status** button to make the changes effective. This will also turn on the UPB70. If this is the first time using the battery, connect a notebook power adapter to the UPB70. Refer to *Section C. Charging the Battery*.

B. Selecting the Correct Tips

Plug: Each is marked with an uppercase letter that corresponds to the notebook computer models listed in the *Universal Notebook Battery Compatibility Guide*. It is used to connect output power from the UPB70 to the input DC voltage port on your notebook.

Jack: Each is marked with a lowercase letter that corresponds to the notebook computer models listed in the *Universal Notebook Battery Compatibility Guide*. It is used to connect the UPB70 to a power source such as your notebook power adapter or any APC Universal Power Adapter (sold separately). See *Figure 1*.

C. Charging the Battery

Once the output voltage setting and appropriate plugs / jacks have been selected, APC recommends fully charging the UPB70 prior to use. See *Figure 1*.

1. Attach the plug to the UPB70 output power connector.
2. Attach the jack to the UPB70 input power connector.
3. Connect your notebook's power adapter, any APC Universal Power Adapter, or other compatible power adapter to the battery.
4. The UPB70 indicators should illuminate. If not, ensure the power adapter is connected to a power source and the power source is ON. See *Troubleshooting* for additional details.
5. Charge the UPB70 for at least three hours or until fully charged, prior to first use.

D. Operation of the UPB70

With Notebook Computer: When the UPB70 is properly connected to your notebook computer, it will appear to be on utility power. For optimal battery runtime, adjust your notebook computer's power settings. (Refer to *notebook user manual* or *control panel* for more user information on changing power mode settings).

If your notebook power adapter, APC Universal Power Adapter, or other compatible power adapter is removed from the UPB70, the UPB70 will serve as the primary power source for your notebook computer. If any of these notebook adapters are present, power will pass through the UPB70 to your notebook computer.

With Mobile Device: Use an appropriate USB charging cable to power devices such as iPods, MP3 players, mobile phones, PDAs and portable gaming systems. Connect the USB cable to the USB port on the UPB70 and the other end of the cable to the device that needs to be powered. See *Figures 1 & 3*.

Note: USB Charging cables (sold separately) are required to charge your device. APC recommends the use of APC USB Charging cables to ensure compatibility. Please check mobilecomputing.apc.com for the latest list of USB Charging Cables.

E. Checking the Battery Status

The status of the battery is indicated by four LED status indicators and can be checked at any time, by pressing the **Status** button. The various battery status conditions are described below:

Charge The LED status indicators will light up sequentially as each level of charge is reached. Continue charging until the four white indicators are lit together and then turn off, indicating the UPB70 is fully charged.

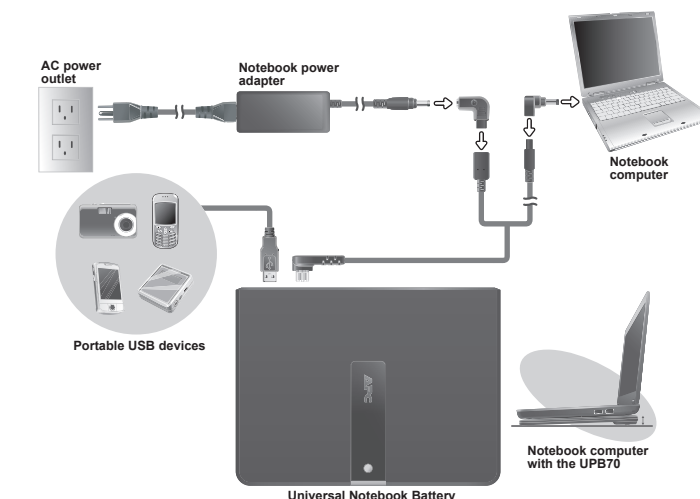
Figure 2: LED Status Indications

Discharge Press the **Status** button to display the discharge status. The LED indicators will illuminate and display the remaining charge level. The number of LEDs that light up indicate the level of discharge as described in *Figure 2*.

Sleep Mode When the UPB70 has been stored or has not been connected to a notebook computer or mobile device for 15 minutes or more, it will enter **Sleep Mode** status. To wake up the battery, press the **Status** button for 1~3 second(s) and then release. The status indicators will illuminate, showing the battery is on and ready for use.

F. Changing Voltage While Battery is in Use

If the output voltage selector switch is moved while the battery is in use, output power to your notebook will be interrupted. To resume power output, ensure that the output voltage selector switch is set to the correct output voltage and press the **Status** button for 1~3 second(s). The status indicators will illuminate, indicating the UPB70 has resumed power output.

H. Troubleshooting

Problem	Possible Cause	Solution
The UPB70 is not charging the notebook when the AC adapter is connected to the UPB70.	Notebook AC adapter output voltage does not match the output voltage setting on the output voltage selector switch.	Check the voltage rating from the system label on the notebook or power adapter. Slide the output voltage selector switch to the corresponding voltage. Press the Status button for 1~3 second(s) and then release. The LED indicators will illuminate and the battery will resume power output.
	The UPB70 has automatically shut down due to abnormally high temperature.	Remove the UPB70 from the enclosed area, and let it cool for a few minutes. Press the Status button for 1~3 second(s) and then release. The unit will recover from thermal protection mode.
	The notebook being used is drawing more than 80W from the UPB70.	The UPB70 is designed to deliver 80 Watts of continuous output power. Perform one of the following to resume the UPB70 power output: 1. Fully charge the notebook internal battery using the adapter provided with the notebook; connect the UPB70 to the notebook. OR: 2. Change the power settings on the notebook to conserve battery power.
When not connected to a notebook computer, UPB70 does not provide power (LED indicators do not illuminate).	When the UPB70 has been stored or has not been connected to a notebook computer for 15 minutes or more, it will enter Sleep Mode status.	Press the Status button for 1~3 second(s) and then release. The Status indicators will illuminate and the battery will resume power output. If no indicators are lit, charge the UPB70.
Mobile device does not charge when UPB70 is connected via manufacturer's USB cable.	1. The UPB70 may have entered the Sleep mode. 2. The manufacturer's USB cable may not support charging functionality.	1. Press the Status button for 1-3 second(s), then release. The status indicators will illuminate and the battery will resume power output. If no indicators are lit, recharge the UPB70. 2. APC recommends the use of APC USB Charging Cables to ensure compatibility. Please check mobilecomputing.apc.com for the latest list of USB Charging Cables.

I. Recycling, Storage, and Battery Life

The UPB70 should be disposed of properly. Please do not incinerate or dispose of in trash receptacles. For more information about APC's battery recycling program, visit: mobilecomputing.apc.com.

For best results, do not store the UPB70 where there is excessive heat or cold, as such environments can damage the battery pack and reduce battery life. If storing the UPB70 for an extended period, completely discharge and recharge the unit before the next use.

To completely discharge: Attach the UPB70 to a notebook and wait until all LED indicators are off during use.

To completely charge: Attach any compatible notebook power adapter to the UPB70 and continue charging it until all Status indicators are extinguished.

For best results, the UPB70 should be completely discharged and recharged once every 3 months. This will condition the cells inside the battery and ensure the UPB70 delivers the most capacity available.

J. Limited Warranty

APC warrants its products to be free from defects in materials and workmanship under normal use and service for one (1) year from the date of purchase for the original purchaser. Its obligation under this warranty is limited to repairing or replacing, at its sole option, any such defective products. To obtain service under warranty, you must obtain a Returned Material Authorization (RMA) number from APC or an APC Service Center with transportation charges prepaid. It must be accompanied by a brief description of the problem and proof of date and place of purchase. This warranty applies only to the original purchaser.
